Podcast Recommendations from Reb Shoshanah

Dear KHE Community:

For quite a few years now I have been regularly listening to four free podcasts which it occurs to me may be of interest to some of you. Here they are, not listed in any special order:

Israel Story: the Israeli version of "This American Life," Israel Story brings the unique stories of a wide variety of folks who live in this land. If you find them interesting, I even recommend listening to all of their back podcasts from the past several years.

Unholy: Two Jews on the News: presented by Yonit Levi, leading broadcaster of Channel 12 news on Israeli TV, and Jonathan Friedland, leading author and reporter for the Guardian newspaper in Great Britain. So together they represent Israel and the Jewish diaspora, discussing intelligently and personally each week the latest events, and interviewing highly informed and often well- known guests on relevant topics.

Unorthodox: Produced in New York through Tablet, this highly entertaining and informative program has 3 Jews shmoozing and interviewing guests about all aspects of being Jewish, plus a 'gentile of the week' interview, plus presenting and discussing letters they receive in their mailbox, plus visiting and sharing the backgrounds and current life of various Jewish communities around the US, plus, plus, plus....can swing from the inane to deeply serious.

The Promised Podcast: A quirky, intelligent rendering by Noah Efron, former Tel Aviv city council member from the Green Party, of whatever touches his heart and that of his recurring guests (Linda Gradstein, former NPR correspondent from Israel; , Allison Sommers, HaAretz reporter, Sally Abed, co-founder of Standing Together) regarding life in Tel Aviv, a city he dearly loves, and recent events in Israel and the world. He often presents fascinating background material you wouldn't hear elsewhere.
