"The Chosen" is a popular 1981 movie starring Rod Steiger. It is based on Rabbi Chaim Potok's bestselling book of the same name (Simon and Schuster, 1967).

"This historical drama takes place from 1944-1948 in the Williamsburg district of Brooklyn, a factionalized neighorbood of Hasidic and Orthodox Jews who rarely mix or interact. After a ballgame between rival yeshivas turns ugly, an unlikely friendship develops between two teenagers from the competing teams. As Zionism surges after the end of WWII, the boys' influential fathers take opposing positions, threatening their sons' friendship as they grow into adulthood."

Don't get me wrong, I'm not kvetching...I'm kvelling that there's been so much energy and response to this blog! This is a real kinnahurrah! Such a blessing! So, Nu? What am I gonna write about?

I must admit and apologize for my frequent errors throughout the Shema. The truth? I get so verklempt when giving Bob the details. And now that its warm outside, I am schvitizing, too! I send him wrong dates, wrong names, wrong information...the whole megillah. There's so many details, I could platz! Bob, thank you for your patience. You are such a mensch!

So tonight, before I could sit down and write, I had to have a little nosh. I'm such a baleboste, there's always a good bissel nosharie to enjoy; especially as the holidays are approaching.

That day, me and my goyisha friends had a seltzer bottle fight in the garage. Yep, Dad always had a case of seltzer and two jars of Fox's Chocolate Syrup delivered right into the garage. Oy, now drinking that was a real mechiah! But anyway... we made a mess...all I recall is Mom calling those trombeniks, those meshugahnah nogoodniks some other names that don't belong here. I got put on restriction, just for having some fun on a hot day; and trying to assimilate.

That's another topic: Bringing up Jewish children in a non-Jewish friendly county. The non-verbal message was "assimilate"; blend in...but when I tried; I got in trouble.


